Holole'a is a culturally based, eco-tour of Loko Ea, a 400-year-old Hawaiian fishpond in Hale'iwa Town (O'ahu). Ancient Hawaiians created fishponds like Loko Ea to actively manage their most prized aquaculture. The fish they sustainably raised fed ali'i (Hawaiian chiefs). Today, Loko Ea is a truly unique place of history and of the future. We educate visitors in cultural practices and are working to restore the pond so that it may once again feed the community.
